# Zoology Department Biological Tour Report

4<sup>th</sup>-10-2024

## Introduction

The Department of Zoology, consisting of 35 students and two staff members, Dr. V. Uday Kiran (Lecturer in Zoology) and Mr. N. Bala Vengamuni (Lecturer in Chemistry), organized a biological tour with the aim of exploring diverse ecosystems and gaining a deeper understanding of various biodiversity-rich regions. The tour commenced on the 4th of the 10<sup>th</sup> month and spanned over four days, covering significant places of religious, ecological, and scientific importance in Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry. This report outlines the details of the tour, the places visited, and the experiences gained.

### Day 1: Departure from Pulivendula

On the evening of the 4th, all participants gathered on the college campus at 6:00 PM to begin the journey with a prayer, seeking blessings for a safe and fruitful trip. The journey started at 8:30 PM after the final arrangements were made, and the group embarked on the trip with excitement and anticipation.

The first stop was at Gandhi Anjaneya Devasthanam, a popular temple where the group had dinner at around 9:30 PM. After this brief break, the team resumed their journey and continued through the night towards Arunachalam.

### Day 2: Arunachalam and Pichavaram

The group reached Arunachalam on the 5th of the month, early in the morning at 6:00 AM. After freshening up, the group visited the renowned Arunachalam Temple for *darshan*. The temple, known for its rich cultural and spiritual significance, provided a serene and calming start to the day. After completing the *darshan*, everyone enjoyed a hearty breakfast.

Following the temple visit, the group moved toward Pichavaram, a location famous for its mangrove forests, after having lunch. The team indulged in a boating experience in the backwaters of Pichavaram, gaining firsthand knowledge of the biodiversity and environmental importance of this coastal habitat. After the boat ride, the group departed for Chidambaram, where they visited the Nataraja Swamy Temple in the late evening for another round of *darshan*. The spiritual atmosphere of the temple added a reflective element to the tour.

By midnight, the group reached the Youth Hostel in Pondicherry, where they retired for the night after a long and fulfilling day.

### **Day 3: Pondicherry and Mahabalipuram**

On the morning of the 6th, the group began their day with a visit to Eden Beach in Pondicherry. Known for its scenic beauty and tranquil environment, Eden Beach provided an opportunity for everyone to unwind and appreciate the coastal ecosystems.

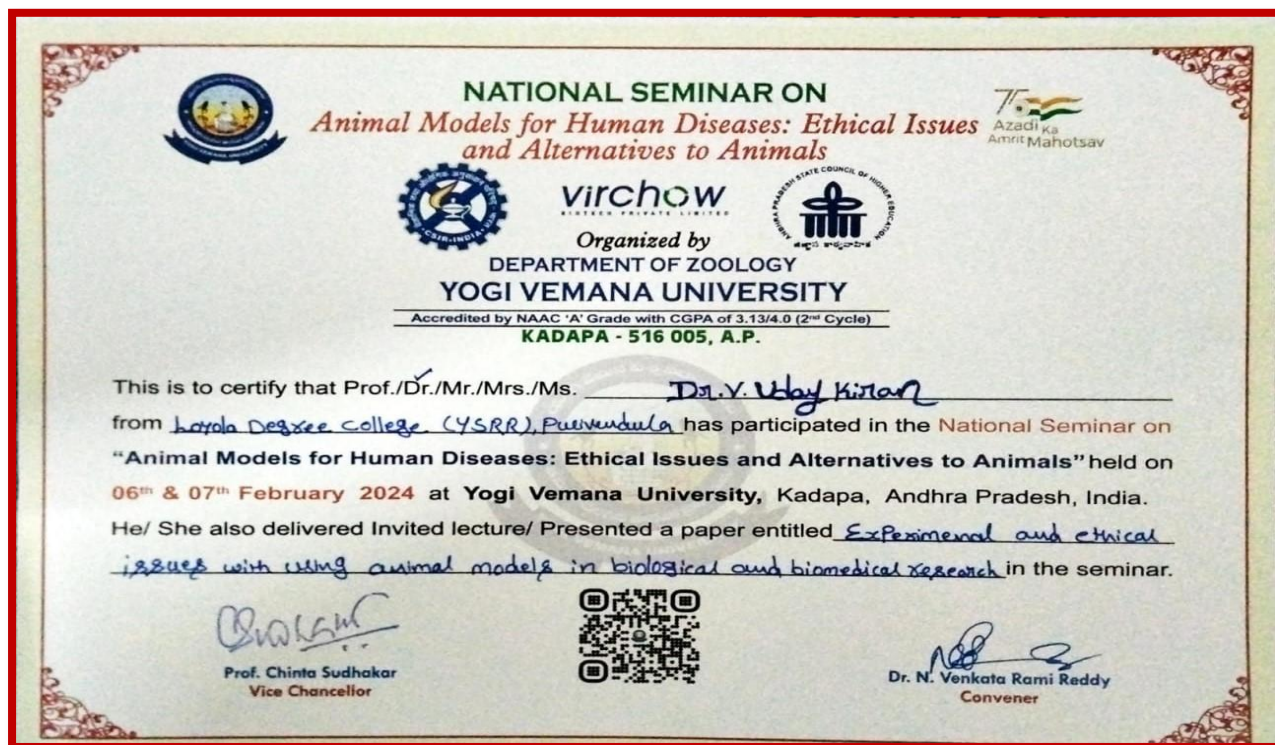
